ILLUMINATED: OUR FATHER

Another good question. But let's stick with the basics. For now. [camera jerks back to the prayer] The Lord's Prayer starts with "Our Father in heaven, holy is your name..." So step one-who are we following?

God.

Right. Easy. And here he's called holy.

Holy. Holy... holy moly... [holes are drawn on the God silhouette]

Sure. That's natural. But this reminds us that God knows best. He's Lord of our life. And if we want the best for ourselves and everyone else, we should always ask-- am I doing what I want? Or am I doing what God wants?

"Give us this day our daily bread..."

I mean, yeah, sometimes it literally means food. God provides for us. Some people focus on this line to say we don't have to worry about tomorrow, but to rely on God each day for all the things we need.

But to answer "what does God want?" we go with another definition of "bread." One used by Jesus.

I thought this was going to be easy! Step one, two, three, and you're good.That kind of thing. Following Jesus and walking with God is a lifelong thing. And sometimes it's really hard.

Following Jesus doesn't sound hard... it sounds practically impossible. Is there a cheat code? Can I change the difficulty level? Maybe do this whole thing on easy mode?

The last part of the Lord's Prayer does something kinda like that. "Lead me not into temptation, but deliver me from the evil one." Following God won't be easy, but we are supposed to pray that God wouldn't let what we want get the best of us...

...and when it does, because it will, that He'd save us from our enemy... the one that would use it against us and stop us from walking with God.

Heh heh! He's with us every step of the way, huh? So God *knows* we're going to mess up. And He's still on our side?

Yep.

And he can squish the enemy so we can keep walking...

Every day. Right back to the beginning!

God is HOLY!! And our Dad. He rules his kingdom and we want His kingdom here, now! So we say, God wills it!! And try to want what he wants. To know Him and understand what he wants, we eat up the Bible every day, om nom! But we *know* he wants forgiveness for us and others, because Jesus died and came back for us. And he's with us every step of the way... we can ask for help to not mess up... but when we do, he can save us.
